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Ashley feels well supported

Ashley (not her real name) commenced in the ParentsNext program in December 2018. She has two children in her care who have high caring needs which made Ashley eligible for an exemption from the ParentsNext program. After her initial appointment and knowing the benefits of the program, Ashley decided to voluntarily stay on with the program.

Ashley had never got a driver's license and it was very difficult for her to use public transport with her autistic child. With no social support until she started on the ParentsNext program with Djerriwarrh, she was facing a real struggle to cope with the daily challenges of life. She had very limited capacity to achieve her career goals.

Ashley had previously completed a course in hospitality but had limited experience and wanted to change her career.

Ashley mentioned to her

ParentsNext consultant that she really wanted to be a nurse but didn't feel confident in completing the necessary qualification.

With individually tailored an support plan and regular career counselling, Ashley has started her intermediate **VCAL** level certificate. This is due to be completed by the end of 2019. Next year Ashley wants to enroll in the senior level so that she is ready Diploma start her Nursing by 2021. Ashley said,

"I already feel confident and excited to be able to go into further study"

In July 2019 Ashley gained her learner's permit and is now getting regular driving lessons. She is building her experience so she can get her driver's license.

Ashley praised her consultant for the support she has received and said

"I have had a very positive experience with the ParentsNext program and I'm very motivated to work towards my goals."

1. ParentsNext National Conference

Djerriwarrh Community & Education Services' CEO and the ParentsNext Manager attended the ParentsNext National Conference in Sydney on 30-31st October.

The conference focused on receiving provider feedback on what is working well in the program, as well as highlighting areas for improvement. Providers also heard from the Department of Employment, Skills, Small and Family Business (Department) about the future direction of the program. Guest speakers presented on topics related to domestic and family violence, mental health, culturally & linguistically diverse communities and Indigenous Australians and shared best practice ideas on how ParentsNext providers can better support a diverse range of participants.

Both the Minister for Employment and Minister for Indigenous Australians presented.

It was great to hear of the significant national impact that the ParentsNext program has made between 1 July 2018 and 30 September 2019 and celebrate some of our key successes with our peers:

- 100,000 parents have been supported
- 36,000 parents have commenced education and/or training
- 15,000 parents have exited the program due to securing ongoing employment
- There has been a 70% increase in Work Readiness indicating increased motivation in parents to study and plan for their future work

It was also good to hear that the Department continues to receive feedback from the community and providers and incorporate program changes that help to make activity reporting easier and more flexible for parents. Some of the changes that have already been implemented are:

 If you are a participant in fulltime education and that is also your ParentsNext activity,

- you will not be required to report you attendance for this activity
- For all other activities, activity reporting requirements will be reduced to no more than once per fortnight
- If participants let their provider know of their Centrelink reporting date, they will consider this when scheduling activities and appointments to reduce the risk of receiving a temporary hold on their payments

We are extremely proud of our organisation's contribution to these national results and we thank the Department for their vision and support in helping parents with young children achieve their full potential.

2. 2020 The Year Of Collaboration

Our ParentsNext team has been hard at work to help improve our participants' lives. We are always looking for ways to help our participants by getting them into education and training and by providing assistance to help them achieve their goals.

In November we held focus groups with ParentsNext participants at our Sunshine office. We wanted to get their feedback on the program enhancements and discuss their ideas for how we could better support our participants.

In February 2020 our Sunshine ParentsNext office is planning to team up with Bunnings Sunshine to run a monthly "parents get-together club" for basic DIY household maintenance and skill development.

We are also planning monthly employment workshops for 2020. These workshops will teach participants the tips and tricks for applying and gaining employment. It is anticipated to be one of the most sought after workshops especially for parents who want to return to work after a long break.

We are also planning to deliver monthly parent and child groups around healthy food/cooking, mental health, swimming/summer safety, financial wellbeing and sewing classes.
